

The Question – Reopening?

"Pastor, when will the church open up again?; When can we come back together for worship?"

I've had just a couple of people ask me that question, but I am sure that more of you are also asking it. When can we come back to church?

Well, you are not the only ones asking that question. In every meeting I have had in the past two weeks, with our Congregation Council, with the task force our council established to discuss this question, with our Bishop, with our Synod's Conference Deans, with the pastors of the Beaver Dam Conference, with my text study, and with my Clergy Leadership Group, this has been one of the main topics of conversation – if not the only topic of conversation. The ELCA and the Wisconsin Council of Churches have issued guidelines for the reopening of inperson worship services and Dane County has issued Forward Dane for the reopening on businesses in Dane County. (To my knowledge, Jefferson County has not issued any such directive.)

Among all of the groups and pastors I have met with, the universal opinion is that we need to take our time before reopening. Do you remember the phrase that we picked up back when we first cancelled our worship services on March 14^{th} and 15^{th} – "out an abundance of caution?" Since then, there have been news stories of churches that had refused to close, where outbreaks occurred and people died. This is the burden that our pastors bear. We do not want any of our parishioners to get sick, or even die, as a result of coming to worship – and yet, we must still worship.

Online

Our online worship will continue at St. Paul's. Our Sunday services will be live on Facebook at 9:00, posted to our YouTube channel and website later that day, and put on the cable access channel during the week.

We will continue to have a Wednesday Evening Prayer service at 7:00 on Facebook.

It is our intention that streaming our Sunday service on Facebook Live will be a permanent part of our worship from now on.

In-person - Outdoors

"In-person worship" is a phrase I'd never heard before. Back in the pre-pandemic days, it was assumed that worship was in-person. But, of course, that has now changed, along with so much else.

Our council appointed a task force to discuss moving back to in-person worship at St. Paul's. The members are Sue Quamme, Jean Tousignant, Helen Hebel, Jill Oelke, and myself. We are also cautious about resuming in-person worship – especially in the church building. As the virus is transmitted by aerosols, gathering people indoors is more dangerous that gathering outdoors.

Likewise, group singing is dangerous if there is one person who is infected, but asymptomatic. In this regard though, Summer is our friend.

While we are not planning any indoor worship services, we are planning an outdoor service on Sunday, June 14th at 9:00am. (We plan to have this service posted live to Facebook, and will also film a service indoors for YouTube and cable access.)

Rules for the Service:

- We plan to gather in the lower area of the parking lot, between the building and the river.
- We are limiting attendance to 25 members. If we have many more people sign up for this service, we will offer a 2nd service as well.
- We will be sending out an email with a link to sign up for the service. You may also call the church office to sign up.
- Bring your own chairs, or stand during the service.
- Household groups are to maintain social distance of 6 ft. between groups. We ask that this distance be maintained before, during, and after the service. There will be no fellowship hour following the service.
- It is "strongly recommended" that you wear masks. While the wearing of masks has become a "hotbutton" issue in our country, we ask that you do this voluntarily as a sign of respect and care for our fellow members. We hope to have masks available if needed.
- We will not be celebrating Holy Communion at this service, nor do we intend to have any congregational singing.

After the service on the 14th, we will assess how things went, and keeping an eye on the status of the virus, we will make further plans.

Holy Communion – On Pentecost (June 7) and by Appointment

Many congregations are doing many different things regarding Holy Communion. We are all concerned with being able to celebrate communion both faithfully and safely. We ourselves celebrated Holy Communion online during our Easter Sunday worship service. We will be doing this again on Pentecost Sunday – June 7th.

Preparations for Pentecost Celebration of Holy Communion

- Prepare a table to use as your home altar. A coffee table, end table, dining room or kitchen table, etc. Clean it off. You may want to put flowers on it or decorate it in a special way.
- Bread and Wine (or grape juice) enough for each person who will commune.
- Communion Distribution who will distribute the bread and wine to each person, or will you pass it around the circle. Give a blessing to those who do not yet receive communion.

In addition, we will also begin offering communion by appointment. You may email me <u>PastorRKosky@gmail.com</u>, call me at (608) 345-2463, or leave a message on the answering machine at church, to schedule a time for you, or your family to come in to receive Holy Communion. This may be done inside or outside, depending on the weather.
