From the Pastor's Desk...

Updates

I've never really liked making phone calls. I'm probably not alone in this. I would much rather touch base with someone in person. And so, it is not unusual that I will try to catch someone before or after a Sunday morning worship service to check up with them about something, or to ask them the question I have needed to ask them. But nowadays, that does not work so well.

As fellow members of St. Paul's, we don't see each other as frequently as we used to and we are not as up to date on what is going on in each other's lives as we were six months ago. I have made phone calls to some of you just to be in touch and hear how you are doing. A few of you have called me to me and my family, or to let me know about something that is going on. I've seen some of you during my office hours – either out in the front yard of the church or actually in my office. And we try to keep you informed on what's happening, especially with our worship services, through the newsletter, Facebook, email, and our website.

It takes a little more effort to keep up with one another during these Covid days. Take some time to call friends from church just to catch up, to express your care, to share the peace and love of Jesus with one another.

A Worship Update

Our worship committee met in August and our basic plan is to continue our current schedule for as long as the weather holds.

We are pre-recording a worship service each week for our local cable station and for Youtube. A link is being posted on our Website and on Facebook each Sunday morning. I am also making an effort to learn a little about video editing in order to make this a better worship experience for you all.

We are also holding an in-person worship service in our parking lot, with lawn chairs, at 9:00 on Sunday mornings. This is also posted live on Facebook. In the event of rain on a Sunday morning, we will move this service inside the church and observe appropriate protocols. We encourage members to wear masks to this service.

We have made initial preparations for moving our worship back indoors for if or when that becomes feasible. We have removed hymnals and communion cards. We have blocked off certain pews and marked recommended places for seating so as to maintain social distance. We have masks available for members who have forgotten to bring one. We believe we can accommodate about 40 people in our sanctuary in this way.

At this time, we do not have a plan for returning to indoor worship. If the spread of the Coronavirus gets worse in the fall and the winter, as it is expected to, we may not return to indoor worship until sometime in 2021. (It has taken about two months for that fact to sink into my brain. I remember back to the end of March when I could scarcely believe that we wouldn't be back inside by Easter – and then hearing of a congregation that had cancelled their indoor services through the end of April. It was astounding!)

A good friend of my wife's is the Bishop of the Northwest Washington Synod of the ELCA. She is recommending to their congregations that they not plan on opening until at least February (and she is thinking maybe even June.) I also heard her talking to Lisa about ideas for how congregations can celebrate Christmas Eve services this year.

I believe that we can figure all of this out. That we can still worship in ways that honor God and feed our souls. We can find ways to connect to one another and we can create meaningful worship that one day we will be able to look back on and say, "Remember how we did that back in 2020..." As we are open to the guiding of the Holy Spirit, we can do this together.

A Financial Update

In 2019, we spent a lot of time worrying about the finances of St. Paul's and had a lot of concern about the budget. As you may remember, early in 2019 we ran out of the reserve funds we had been using to help support our budget for several years. We were then in a pinch and a situation where our financial support of St. Paul's would have to grow or we would need to make some major cuts to the budget. Throughout 2019 our support of St. Paul's did grow – remarkably so. We were still worried about what would happen in 2020 though. I can tell you that our support of St. Paul's has continued to increase through the first 7 months of this year. Our financial support through July has been about \$9,000 above the same period in 2019. We are also two or three thousand dollars in the black relative to our spending so far this year.

I have always believed that God has called us to be members of St. Paul's, and has both called us, and given us the means, to support this ministry. God has been faithful in providing for us, and I see us as growing in our faithfulness in supporting our ministry. As your pastor, I am amazed and humbled by the responses of so many of our members who have grown in your giving over the past two years – in both big and small ways – as God has given you the ability. But I am not at all surprised – for God has gifted us with faith and strength beyond our imaginings.

A Synod Update

Bishop Peter Rogness has served our South-Central Synod of Wisconsin as an interim bishop since last October and has led us through a process of nominating candidates to serve as the next called Bishop of our Synod. On Saturday, August 29th we will hold our Synod Assembly (online) and we will elect our next Synod Bishop. Bishop Rogness will serve through the end of September and our new Bishop will begin on October 1st.

A Confirmation (and Sunday School) Update

We were able to hold Confirmation services for our 12 confirmands over the summer, worship with about 3 families at a time outside. This coming year we will have about 15 students in 7th and 8th grades for our confirmation classes. As of right now, I have not decided how and when we will be meeting. What I have decided is that I am not going to start classes until probably October.



We have school starting up in a couple of weeks and things are going to be different this year all the way around. I plan to get in touch with confirmation families to talk about the coming year and what we will be doing. You may also feel free to get in touch with me.

I haven't touched base with our Sunday School people yet, but I think the same will probably apply there as well.

Well, this has been a longer letter than usual, but I hope you have appreciated the updates. Please feel free to be in touch with me with your own update, and May God's Blessings and Peace be with you all,
